



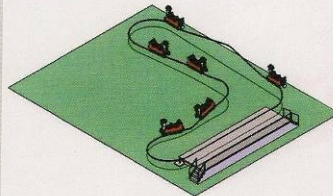

Vekoma Rides

The manufacturer from the Netherlands has announced further installations only two months after the Euro Attractions Show: the Chinese park OCT Chengdu will receive even in this year a standardised Mine Train and a Suspended Looping Coaster, and a 500 metre long family coaster will be erected at China Powerlong in 2009, built according to customer specifications.

Further along, a custom designed "Motorbike Coaster" will be delivered to another unnamed Chinese park, with its 610 metre long track running inside a building. Vekoma is also building a 335 metre long Junior Coaster for the Indian Innovative Film Studios, as well as a Ferris Wheel. Additionally, the Netherlands are also supplying a theme park near Rome with a 681 metre long Mine Train, a "Sky Shuttle", and an 80 passenger "Mad House".

New installations for the 2010 season have also been announced by Vekoma: firstly the Mine Train planned for 2008 for the Spanish park Isla Magica will go into operation, and secondly, an innovative and unique signature attraction has been announced for a new theme park in South East Asia.

attraction will be erected directly in front of the historic concert hall, a location where up until now a small Ferris Wheel made its rounds. The new attraction will be themed as a huge windmill. Additionally a new concept for a transportable attraction was introduced: "Fluk-Flak" will have two small Topspin-similar gondolas rotating towards each other, so that a near collision is simulated.

abc rides

In our EAS-report (KPR 11/08) we have already introduced the "Vertical Dark Ride" from TAA, which is to be realized in cooperation with abc.

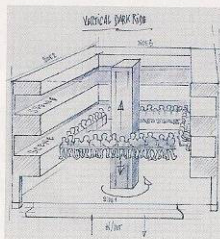
Furthermore, abc rides has announced the following installations for 2009: a 12 metre high indoor "Freefall" will go to the Dungeon in Edinburgh, and another structurally identical construction not operated as a darkride will be erected at the park Hunderfossen in Norway. Denmark's Djurs Sommerland and the British Sealife Centre in Weymouth will each receive a "Mini Flume Ride".

And after a "Maypole" had already been installed at Austrian park Neusiedlersee last season, the same park has now ordered a "Tilt Tower". This 12 metre high freefall tower swings additionally to the both sides, and is only the third construction of this type.

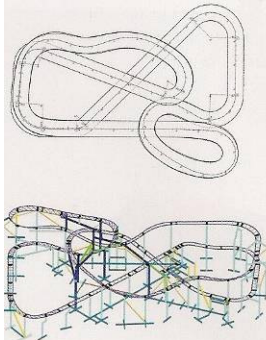
Gerstlauer

The German manufacturer will erect a 255 metre long and 11.5 metre high Spinning Coaster as an indoor construction in the Mall of Kuwait (Owner is the Tamdeen Entertainment Company). The tracks will have a width of 800 mm upon which five 4-seat rotating cars will be used. The ride is planned to go into operation in the spring of 2009.

Technical Park

The Italian manufacturer Technical Park will also have a successful business year. The 2009 season will see the delivery of two new attractions to the traditional Tivoli Park in Copenhagen, Denmark.

"Rocket Reindeers" is a kiddie ride construction with Christmas designed individual cars each accommodating 4 passengers. The cars move at 2 metres per second along a 70 metre long track through tunnels and over maximum three metre high hills. By the way, outside the Christmas period all decoration elements on the cars can be removed.

Moreover, Tivoli will also receive a "Flying Fury" – the second attraction of this type worldwide. This
